

Robilant and Voena co-host a major London Old Masters show as they set up shop in St. Moritz

TWO top Mayfair galleries, Robilant and Voena and Stair Sainty, are holding a joint exhibition 'French Painting 1600-1900' throughout December at the gallery they share at 38 Dover Street, W1. The show, part of which we illustrate, was launched in the first week of December to coincide with Old Master Sales Week.

A high calibre selection of French master works it includes paintings by Poussin, Tissot, Jean-Baptiste Oudry and Gérôme.

December is a particularly busy month for Robilant and Voena who have been dealing in art from the 15th to 21st centuries for the last two decades from their galleries in London and Milan.

On December 8 they opened a new gallery in the centre of the exclusive Swiss town of St. Moritz at Via Serias 35. The large two-floor space in a building designed by Norman Foster will show works from their extensive inventory including Italian views from Canaletto to Guardi; Baroque and Caravaggesque works; Neoclassical paintings and Italian mid-century modernism and artists such as Lucio Fontana and Paolo Scheggi. Currently on show in St. Moritz are artists including Guardi, Canaletto, Warhol, Fontana and Jeff Koons.

Edmondo di Robilant and Marco Voena will continue to be a presence at major international fairs like Maastricht, Frieze Masters, Masterpiece and the Paris Biennale.
